Dear Residents and Team Members,

We hope this letter finds you safe and well.

As you are aware, due to the steady rise in cases across Massachusetts, Governor Baker has rolled back portions of the re-opening plan, all of which apply to us as residents of the Commonwealth, and some which apply to us within The Loomis Communities.

The roll back to indoor gatherings of 10 people applies only to personal residences and therefore the auditorium at Loomis Village and the Longfellow Room at Loomis Lakeside at Reeds Landing are not impacted. The capacity for our public spaces as outlined in the letter of July 20, 2020, remains in place. This change by the Governor is in response to the tracing of many cases to large parties and gatherings in people's homes.

Governor Baker did not make any adjustments to restaurant capacity and therefore there are no changes to the dining rooms.

Researchers have now determined that the Covid-19 virus can travel through the air well beyond 6 feet. Therefore the mask wearing has been extended to include anytime we are outside of our homes regardless of our ability to social distance.

As always for all, masks, social distancing, and proper hand hygiene are essential at all times; and they remain a critical factor in the health and safety of all residents, team members, and guests. Thank you for all you have done over these last several months. It has not been easy, but it is working.
