Dear Residents and Team Members,

We hope this letter finds you safe and well.

As we move into a new month and season, we are happy to report that we remain COVID-free at all three of The Loomis Communities.

Small and careful steps have been taken to provide opportunities for socialization over the past few months. We have taken advantage of the beautiful weather and outdoor areas at the communities to show outdoor movies, concerts, car shows, visits with family and friends, and other activities. As promised in our last letter, we have been working to establish a strategy for visiting opportunities as we move indoors to escape the cold that is on its way. It is the responsibility of any visitor traveling from other states to go to Mass.Gov and follow the travel orders outlined therein.

Beginning Monday October 5th we will again welcome visitors indoors under the following general guidelines (which may vary slightly by community):

A. For Independent Apartments:

- All visitors must be screened upon entering the building
- Visitors must go directly to the resident's apartment
- Visitors are not able to access common areas
- Limit of 2 visitors at each visit

B. For Assisted Living Apartments:

- All visitors must be screened upon entering the building
- Visitors must go directly to the resident's apartment
- Visitors are not able to access common areas
- Limit of 1-2 visitors at each visit, based on social distancing ability.

C. For Nursing Center:

- All visits must follow the DPH guidelines at a minimum
- All visitors must be screened upon entering the building
- Visitors must be scheduled in advance
- Visitors will be escorted to the designated visitation area
- Limit of 2 visitors at each visit

More specific details will be provided by each community's Executive Director about the visits.

Whenever possible, keep windows or doors open to provide ventilation. Outdoor visits are considered the safest option, and we encourage you to do so whenever the weather permits.

As always for all: masks, social distancing, and proper hand hygiene are essential at all times during visits, and remain a critical factor in the health and safety of all residents, team members, and guests.
